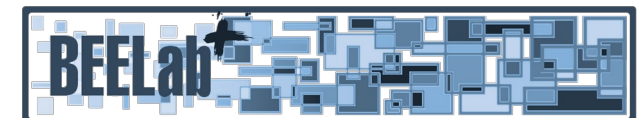

CALL FOR PAPERS

We invite submissions of original research papers for a workshop at the intersection of **behavioural and experimental economics**, with a focus on **economic inequality, discrimination** and its broader social consequences.

We welcome contributions addressing, but not limited to, the following themes:

- Discrimination in economic decision-making and labour markets.
- Ethnic, racial, and socioeconomic discrimination in markets and institutions.
- Gender inequality in bargaining, strategic interaction, and wage outcomes.
- In-group/out-group dynamics, social identity, and intergroup conflict.
- Preferences for redistribution and attitudes toward inequality.
- Behavioural foundations of tax compliance, public goods, and redistribution policy.
- How exposure to inequality and polarization shapes beliefs, norms, and social behaviour.
- Intergenerational transmission of inequality and inequality of opportunity.
- Adaptation to unequal environments and its consequences for welfare and social cohesion.
- Experimental and causal methods for studying inequality and discrimination.

We are particularly interested in work that goes beyond documenting inequality to explore how individuals and societies react and adapt to it, and what this means for economic outcomes, social norms, and institutional design.

Submissions may include completed papers as well as advanced work in progress.
